



RULE VARIATIONS SENIOR DOMESTIC

Competition

Games are played every Monday (except public holidays) from 6:40pm-9:10pm start times. Our stadium is Broadmeadows Basketball Stadium- Cnr Dimboola Rd and Tanderrum Way.

We have Men's and Women's divisions on Monday and Wednesday evenings. Players may play on both nights but cannot play for two teams on the same night.

Player Registrations

Players who wish to participate in the Senior Competition must be registered through the online system to be eligible for finals.

Maximum allowed is 10 players on your team list. You can have 5 on court and need a minimum of 4 to play. Most teams have 6-8 players.

Scorer

Each team is required to provide a competent scorer to operate the stadium scoring tablet or scoreboard during their game.

Uniform Policy

Players must have an acceptable basketball uniform. For this purpose the basketball team uniform shall consist of a uniformly coloured singlet or T-shirt bearing a contrasting number on the front and back, and uniformly coloured shorts.

Taped, pencilled, texta coloured and unnumbered tops do not comply with this By-law. Players must have uniformly coloured tops and legal number to take the court.

A team whose player(s) are wearing incorrect shorts, relative to the team registration form details, will be penalised a maximum total of ten (5) points per game in which this infringement occurs as from the commencement of round four (4) of competition.

- No NBA Jerseys or uniform are to be worn as playing uniform.
- No different colour tops and shorts
- A player may not wear shorts that have pockets

Walkover Fee

A walkover fee will be applied when a team calls a forfeit. The forfeit fee must be paid before the teams next game.

Finals

Finals are played over the final two weeks of each. Most competitions play a top 4 or 8 team system- depending on the number of teams in your competition. Players are required to play in seven games during the season to qualify to play in finals.

Respectful Behaviour

We remind all players and spectators that basketball should be played in an enjoyable, although competitive, environment.

Our referees are human and like players, will make mistakes sometimes. The vast majority of referees are past junior players and help out as a hobby and to give back to the club. We have referee coaches and supervisors present during competitions to ensure a high standard and provide training and feedback to officials.

We ask players to respect the decisions of referees and other volunteers involved in our competitions. If you have a grievance, we ask you to follow the proper channels through a referee supervisor or the Association to have them resolved.

There are Basketball Victoria issued Codes of Conduct on our website that players, coaches, officials, spectators and administrators must adhere to. Breach of these codes can result in persons being placed on report and subject to penalty by a tribunal.
